SOUTH CALGARY COLTS ATOM COLTS PLAYER/PARENT HANDBOOK Overview

Welcome To the South Calgary Colts Organization

Colts Atom Football is a developmental football program for 8-10 year old athletes. Our program is centered on introducing the game of football to these athletes in a safe and fun environment. We will motivate these players and help them to develop a love for the game. We want players and parents to enjoy their experience with The Colts Football Club and become part of our Colts family. We accomplish this through high level, qualified coaching, top quality management, and by providing the best equipment available with first class physical preparation. Our goal is to create young athletes who want to continue in our organization and progress through the Peewee, Bantam and Spring League levels, while providing a positive experience for our kids. We look forward to another outstanding year of Colts Football. The South Calgary Colts is founded on the following four values in this order:

Faith

Family

School

Football

We support our players in all their areas of commitment and development.

Playing Time

Atom is a foundational age group for learning to play football. As such, all players will be given a minimum amount of game play time. Extra Game play time will be determined by attendance and work habits at practice, as well as overall game needs of the team. Commitment is important. The Management and Coaching staff ask that both the players and parents understand and support this philosophy. It is understood that evaluations for hockey and basketball fall during the football season. We want to work collaboratively with parents in regards to this overlap and have parents understand that commitment elsewhere could impact playing time the following game day. Communication with coaches and managers is integral to this process in order to be courteous and to be fair to all involved. We welcome any questions/comments, but would ask that the following process is followed: If a player has any concerns, they are to discuss these concerns with the Coaching staff after a practice in the following order:

1. The player will first discuss with the position Coach.

2. If there are further concerns, the player takes their concerns to the Coordinator.

3. If the issue is still not resolved, the player will talk to the Head Coach.

4. If there is no resolution through this process, only then will the Player's appropriate Coach discuss the matter with the Player's parent.

Advocating for one's self is an important skill to be developed by the athlete. If parents wish to inform the coach that their child wants to discuss an issue with the coaches, then the parent may email the coach in question and a discussion will ensue at the next practice. If a player is in need of further clarification, then a discussion will take place between the parent and the coaches. Coaches and Managers will not discuss any player with a parent other than their child.

Please respect the fact that coaches and players are on the field and in the huddle on a daily basis and a parent may not have the same perspective as those involved. Open, honest and fair communication will ensure that all members benefit and are satisfied with the decision made. Furthermore, post-game time is to celebrate accomplishments, extend compliments and to shake hands. This is what parents can expect from the coaching staff. Other concerns can be broached using the process as noted previously in this section.

Any post game concerns will not be heard for 48 hours after the game. Please respect the cooling off period and address your concerns at the next practice.

Injury Protocol

Football is a contact sport and as such injuries do happen. As a Coaching staff and Management team we take injuries very seriously. We do not want to see your child hurt and take as many steps as possible to ensure the safety of the players. However, when an injury does occur, many of our coaches and managers are First Aid certified and as such if they recommend that your child see a doctor for their injury please ensure you get them in to see one! ALL PLAYERS THAT HAVE BEEN INSTRUCTED TO TAKE TIME OFF THE FIELD DUE TO INJURY REQUIRE A DOCTOR'S NOTE PRIOR TO RETURNING TO PLAY! NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!

Volunteer Commitment

Our team requires volunteers in many positions, it is expected that parents will continue to fill the necessary roles this year as they have in the past. Involvement of parents and families is what builds strength in our Football Club. Colts Managers will be approaching all parents to volunteer for a variety of positions. We look forward to working with you during this Colts Football Season.

To ensure continued parent involvement a Volunteer bond has been instituted. Each family with a player on the Atom Colts will be responsible to fulfill 6 credit units of volunteer time. Upon failure to complete this expectation, a \$200 charge will be issued. Volunteer opportunities will be present throughout the season and families will be notified via TeamSnap or email. Examples of Volunteer opportunities and credit allotment included but are not limited to:

Coach/Manager/ Trainer 10 units Photographer 10 units Videographer 4 units per game Game Ref 4 units per game Water Jug 4 units per game Bottle Drive 10 units - if Volunteer stays for the whole drive Casino Shift 4 units Event Helper 4 units

Game Day Protocol

Players are expected to be at the assigned field 45 minutes before Game Time. This means in full Game Gear (Clean uniforms) and ready to go. Game time and parent field assignments are posted in TeamSnap. All season games are played at Shouldice Park.

PLAYERS – YOU AND YOUR FAMILIES ARE REPRESENTING THE COLTS ORGANIZATION... PLEASE LEARN and adhere WILLINGLY and GRACIOUSLY to the following rules: (Remember some of the following rules may seem obvious, BUT... if they are included it's because it has happened.)

Parking only in Designated Areas: This year cars will be ticketed and may be towed right from the beginning. Respect the signage and PLEASE DO NOT park in front of ambulance lanes.

No Tailgating – This means BBQs, alcohol etc. Gathering together is fine however be aware of the no tailgating rule.

WASHROOMS ONLY are to be used for urinating. There is a \$250 fine to the 'Rule Breaker'. Yes, some have been caught urinating at field level. These people were escorted out, fined and/or suspended and not allowed back to the field. Washrooms are located across from the concession, and at the entrance of the stands at the fields.

NO SMOKING/VAPING within Field Gates. Please move clear of the field and outside of the gates before smoking.

NO PETS within Field Gates. Yes, this includes the little ones that can be carried inside a coat or 'purse'. This is a City of Calgary rule, no matter how small or cute they are...they are NOT allowed.

NO ALCOHOL – Intoxicated spectators will be asked to leave (by taxi or DD).

WATER ONLY AT FIELD LEVEL The fields are artificial turf and therefore trap anything spilled on them. NO GATORADE, COFFEE, TEA by Players or Team Staff.

NO SUNFLOWER SEEDS, CHEWING TOBACCO or SHELL PEANUTS...etc. within Field Gates

PLAYERS – clean up around the team bench.

FANS - clean up around the areas you are seated

FANS: YES > Supportive, Enthusiastic and Constructive NO > Offensive, Insulting, Obnoxious

****** Be aware that Referees can and will call a game or penalize the team over an unruly fan. Your behavior in the stands is a reflection of our Club. Please be a good role model for our kids and walk away if you are feeling frustrated! This is JUST a GAME!**** Breach of the Code of Conduct by either a player or a player's family member will result in the reduction of playing time or dismissal from the club.

Player's Code of Conduct

Players are expected to;

- → Commit themselves to the program
- → Dedicate themselves to the goals and best interests of the team
- → Show respect for fellow athletes, coaches, officials, team and League staff
- → Respect the decisions of the coaching staff
- → Positively communicate with the coaches
- → Be on time, pay attention and be prepared to practice and play
- → Behave and dress in a fashion that reflects positively on the program, the team and themselves
- → Wear team uniforms or apparel whenever directed by the coaching staff
- → Communicate absences in a timely fashion to the Team Managers and update availability on TeamSnap
- → Show respect for other people and property (athletes, coaches, officials, sponsors, equipment, etc...)
- → Refrain from use of foul language, use of any language involving racial slurs or sexual orientation
- → Refrain from bullying
- → Refrain from stealing
- → Refrain from smoking/vaping or drinking alcohol
- → Refrain from using, encouraging the use of, or distributing illegal substances

Parent's Code of Conduct

Parents are expected to;

- → Look out for your child's best interests as they enter, participate in, and exit from the sport
- → Be mindful of the team's and league's best interests
- → Ensure that players are able to meet the expectations of the sport by making sure that they are prepared and on time to practice and to play
- → Monitor your own expectations of your child's performance and progress; realize that athletes who feel they cannot meet their parents' expectations may quickly lose motivation
- → Turn in required paperwork and pay fees by the given deadlines
- → Commit to the specified fundraising activities that form part of the overall program
- → Respect the rules of the practice and playing facilities regarding parking, smoking, drinking alcohol etc.
- → Not interfere or yell instructions to the players, coaches and officials during the games or practices
- → Accept a mistake made by a player, coach or an official without yelling at them

→ Follow the guideline that no parent/guardian or other uninsured individual is allowed on the practice field at any time without permission of the head coach or the coaching staff. This includes siblings etc playing on the practice field. Parents (or designated adult) are also not permitted on the game field unless invited on by team management or coaches.

 \rightarrow 1 Parent or Guardian is to remain at the practice facility in case of emergency. If you need to leave for any reason please communicate that with the team manager prior to leaving.

Understand that any verbal abuse or threat to any member of the League staff, Referees, Colts coaching, management, equipment, or training staff at practice, before, during or after a game or by a parent (or family member) of a player will result in the immediate discipline of that player and where appropriate criminal charges will be pursued. There will be no exceptions. The people involved with the Colts are here to help to coach your son/daughter, take care of any minor injuries or manage the team. All decisions made by the coaches or management are in the best interest of and benefit the entire team. They are VOLUNTEERS who have given up their time so your child can develop their football skills. Without our volunteer coaches and management, there would be no Colts Football. They deserve your courtesy & respect at all times.
